

Powers Catholic High School Owen D. Fisher Scholarship

The Owen D. Fisher Scholarship was established in 2005 by David and Vida Fisher and Katie Fisher MacDonald (Powers Class of 1998) to honor and keep the memory of their son and brother, Owen Fisher.

Owen attended St. Pius X School and continued his Catholic education at Powers, graduating in 2000. He played varsity soccer and was a co-captain during his senior year. He played JV basketball and was in one of the earliest Kairos groups. While at Powers, he developed a talent for writing that flourished in college. A friend who could be counted on when help was needed, Owen possessed a sense of fair play and civility practiced both at home and at school. He benefitted from his Powers Catholic High School education.

Owen found his passion in college: law enforcement. He had found what he wanted to do with his life and that was to serve his community. Upon completing his degree, he was inducted into the national junior college honors society. Shortly after, he joined the Flint Police Department. Flint Police Officer Owen Fisher was killed in the line of duty on July 16, 2005. He had served with the City of Flint Police Department for four months at the time of his death at age 23.

The Fisher Family would like the fund to serve as a challenge fund to encourage other families to contribute and/or match this gift.

- 2. A completed essay explaining what stands out to you about Owen and why it is important to you to attend Powers Catholic High School.
